On Sunday, June 12, 2022 Monthly Meeting approved proceeding with the project to add brick columns and a brick paver walkway at the gap in the Playground fence after the construction of the Alan Boone Court last year.

A plaque will be affixed to each of the columns in the coming days. The paver bricks are also in place. The sample brick (*below right*) has been installed as you can see in the photograph above right.

We have already received orders for several bricks. These may be a tribute or a memorial to loved ones. A brick may contain a special scripture verse or a meaningful verse from an appropriated poem or song.

Our walkway will resemble the walkway in Bicentennial Park in Downtown Asheboro, and the bricks will be made by the same company as those in the park. Each paver brick can be inscribed as a memorial or a tribute for a donation of \$50.00. All profits from this project will support Kids Klub projects and activities. 

Prayer Focus: Lindi Friends School

For many years Lindi Friends School has been a refuge of hope and joy for the children of Kibera, a large urban slum in Nairobi. The school was established in 2005 by Friends in Nairobi, who were called to serve the impoverished families living in Kibera. Today, Lindi Friends School has nearly 340 students in its nursery and primary programs. Many of our graduates pass the national exams, which qualifies them to go on to secondary school.



Friends were shocked to learn of the traumatic fire on the evening of Sunday, 24 July, 2022, that destroyed the school building, leaving only several temporary structures. While an emergency plan was put in place to ensure that educational activities continued, these were only temporary measures, and a permanent solution is now being considered. In the interim, our students are meeting in the temporary structures and the shell of the burnt-out building, which is now covered with a tarpaulin.

In 2023, FUM will partner with Nairobi Yearly Meeting to rebuild the school and replace old structures with permanent ones. While the rebuilding will occur in phases, we anticipate the construction to cost \$211,000. The new building will be on three floors, featuring classrooms, a library, staff rooms and offices, a kitchen, and a multipurpose hall. The new building will provide a safe environment for learning and continue our vital ministry to the families and children of Kibera.



FUM is grateful to be awarded a grant for £20,000 (British pounds, approximately \$24,000 US dollars) from the Robert & Kezia Stanley Chapman Trust, a trust under the care of Friends from Ireland. Friends United Meeting is now receiving donations from other Friends who want to support this rebuilding effort. In addition, we welcome your prayers:

- Pray for the teachers and administrators guiding the school during these trying times.
- Pray for our students as they continue to learn in a harsh educational environment.
- Pray for the families of our students who live under challenging circumstances.
- Pray for the school board and the leaders of Nairobi Yearly Meeting, who are working hard to continue the school's mission and prepare for the future.
- Pray for the fundraising efforts, construction workers, building suppliers, and everyone involved in building the new school.
- Pray that the Lindi Friends School will continue to be a refuge and beacon of hope in the Kibera community.
